Dear Mr. Sperry:

The Company and Union have concluded negotiations for newly represented employees in the Sourcing Specialists unit. The agreed upon contract language and job descriptions are included as attachments to this Agreement.

Implementation Date

All these employees will be included in the general ESC-PG&E contract as of the implementation date of September 1, 2019.

Classification Groups

All classifications will be part of one Line of Progression and one Classification Group in the Contract, to be called "Sourcing Specialists."

Seniority

Seniority shall be determined per Title 13 using each employee's date of hire at PG&E.

Recognition Clause

The parties agree to modify Title 3 of the Contract to reflect the inclusion of these groups by referring to the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) case numbers as shown below and adding the next number to the list in section 3.1:

All classifications will be added to Exhibit A. Bid codes will be established for all positions. This classification group has no specific working conditions. There will be an item added to Exhibit D to mention that Job Descriptions are in Appendix 1.

Incumbents above 2019 Salary Maximum

Employees whose current wage rate is greater than the 2019 maximum of their respective pay range shall have their current wage rate "grandfathered," i.e., they will continue to reside outside the range for their classification. When the next General Wage Increase (GWI) occurs on January 1, 2020, those

employees whose current wage rate is below the 2020 salary range maximum will receive an increase up to the maximum salary (if applicable), and in addition will receive a lump sum payment equal to the difference between the amount of the GWI (3%) and the amount of the salary increase they received. The following table shows the pay increase and lump sums these incumbents will receive on January 1, 2020:
